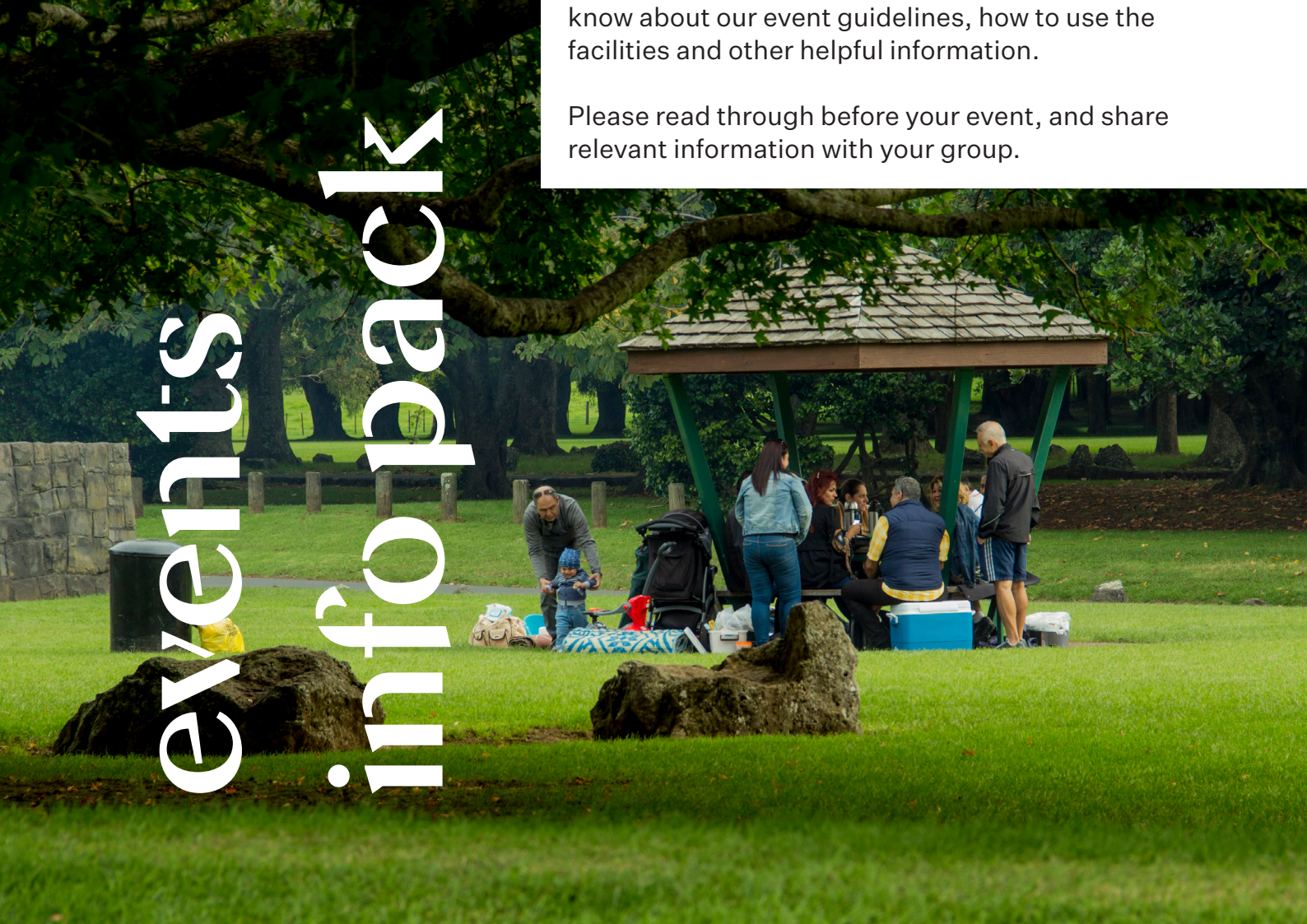


We are happy to welcome you into Cornwall Park for your event!

transport



By car/motorbike

Some interior roads in Cornwall Park are closed/one-way to motor vehicles. These roads include Twin Oak Drive, Olive Grove and the northern end of Kenneth Myers Drive. There is no thoroughfare between Green Lane West and Manukau Rd. Please see the map at the end of this document.

Vehicle access to the main car park, bistro, cafe and the eastern area of the park is through our Green Lane West entrance. Exit from the park is through Greenlane West gates or along Twin Oak Drive to Manukau Rd.

Vehicle access to the archery car park and southern end of the park is via One Tree Hill Domain and Manukau Rd. Exit is through to Manukau Rd also.

Please do not park on the grass and please do not move any rocks that sit along some roads.

We encourage carpooling or using public transport to get to the park.

By bus

70 - Great South Rd outside Countdown (Botany - CBD)
321 - Green Lane West outside ASB (Otahuhu - Grafton)
650 - Green Lane West outside ASB (Pt Chevalier - Glen Innes)
30 - Royal Oak Mall (Onehunga - CBD)
298 - Campbell Rd (Onehunga - CBD)
295 - Royal Oak Mall (Ellerslie - CBD)

By train

Cornwall Park is close to the Greenlane Train Station (by the motorway onramp), around a 15-minute walk. Note there is no parking available at this train station.

By foot or bicycle

There are multiple entrances to the park around the perimeter if you are arriving on foot. You'll find pedestrian gates/stiles along Campbell Rd, Maungakiekie Ave, Crescent Rd, Claude Rd,

- No areas of Cornwall Park can be exclusively “booked” as it is open for all park visitors. If your chosen area is occupied when you arrive you may need to choose another area. We recommend you plan a back-up spot or be willing to move slightly if needed.
- You are unable to “save” areas – please only set up your equipment shortly before your group arrives so other groups can use the area before you.
- We do not allow any signage to be displayed for events, so the best option for letting your group members know the location is to send them a copy of our map below.
- Alcohol is allowed in the park. We ask that you drink responsibly and be considerate of other park users.





set up

Equipment, set-up and pack-down

- Max 50 people per group.
- Small groups (up to 30) can bring seating and tables into the park.
- Please do not bring tarpaulins or tents with bases as this can damage the grass – woven mats and picnic rugs are okay.
- You are permitted 1 x gazebo (maximum 3m x 3m). Ground pegs are prohibited as they are a health and safety issue, so please use weights or sandbags instead.
- Please do not tie/staple anything to trees.
- The only water supply for public use are our drinking fountains. Taps are for Cornwall Park staff use only. Please take anything to wash away with you.
- Please remove all of your rubbish before leaving the area. Larger groups (max 50) are encouraged to bring their own rubbish bags. Please take these away with you or leave the bags next to our rubbish bins. Cornwall Park has limited staff for rubbish so any help you can give is greatly appreciated.
- You may bring a small portable speaker to play music at a low volume so as to not disturb other park users. Amplified sound systems are not permitted.



bbq's

- > We have both gas and wood BBQs in the park.
- > Our BBQs operate on a first-come first-served basis, even if you have an event registered with us. Our BBQs can get very busy on weekends so please be mindful of others by being conscious of waiting groups and clearing away from the BBQs once you have finished cooking.
- > Gas is provided for the gas BBQs and they operate by pressing a button, giving you approximately 10 minutes of cooking time (the process can be repeated for longer cooking times).
- > Wood is provided for the wood BBQs, but please bring a lighter and something to start the fire, and please put it out once you have finished.

Bringing your own BBQ

- > For larger groups (50+) we recommend bringing your own BBQ as you do not have to wait for other groups to finish with our BBQs and you can go to other areas in the park, not confined to the busy BBQ areas.
- > With gas BBQs, we ask that they are lifted off the ground with a stand and not placed close to trees or low-hanging branches.
- > Coal BBQs are permitted in the park but can only be used on the paved area by the wooden BBQs, not on the grass as this is a fire hazard. We ask that you have a water bucket next to the coal BBQ and also that you take the coals home with you. Please do not put them in Cornwall Park rubbish bins as this is also a fire hazard.

health & safety



As the event organiser you are responsible for the health and safety of any employees, volunteers and participants at your event. It is your responsibility to address and manage any potential hazards, including what you may bring or create onsite.

Please obey all Cornwall Park rules and follow any advice given by park staff, security or emergency services personnel during your time in the park. The Cornwall Park Trust Board reserves the right to cancel any bookings that fail to comply with the conditions or are deemed unsafe at any time before the event.

We have security in the park seven days a week. If you are feeling unsafe please call Huia Lodge staff on 09 630 8485.

These regulations are in place to help everyone enjoy the park. Please adhere to the regulations to ensure groups of up to 100 can always have use of the park.

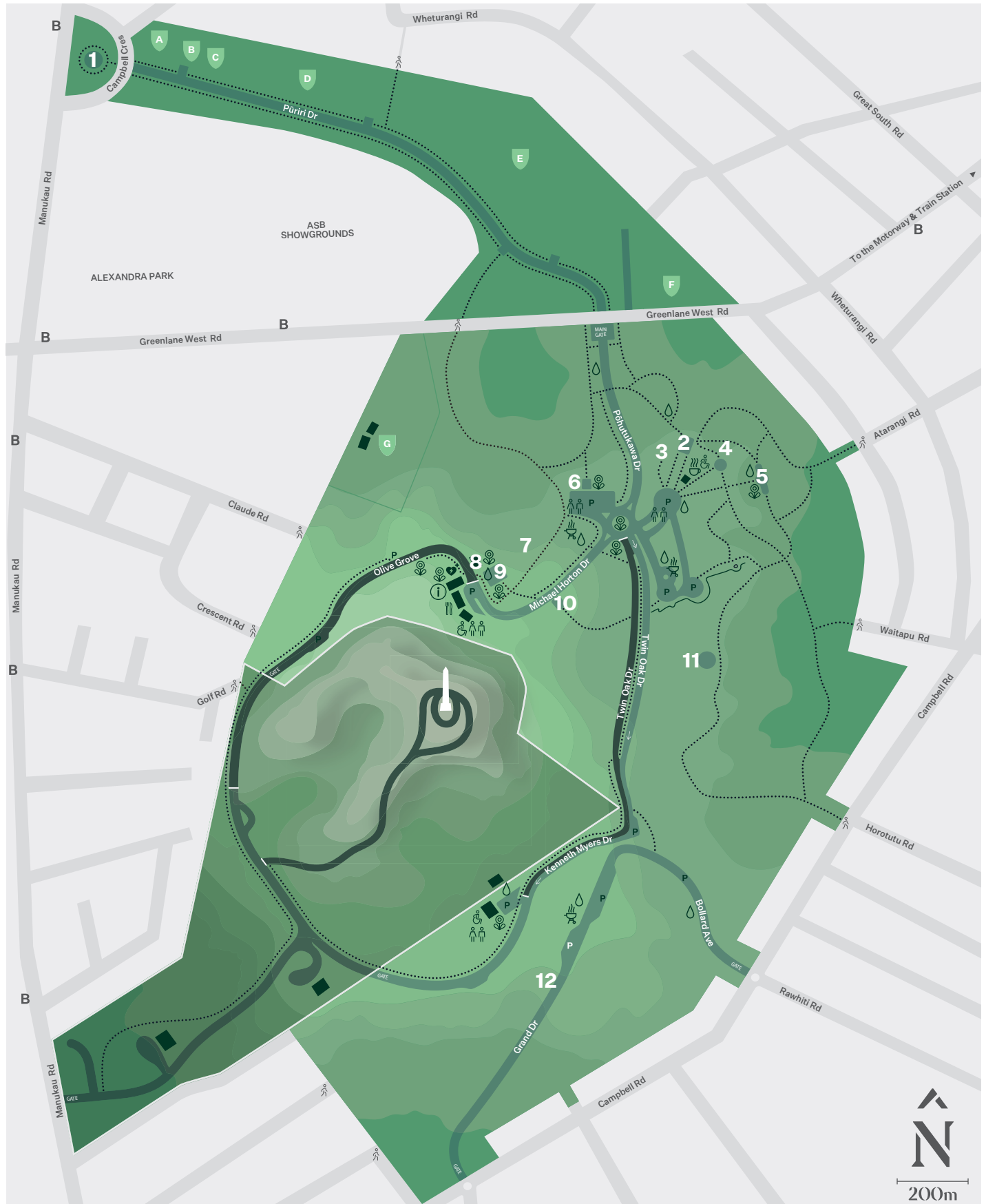
