How to tally your sightings

If you see 2 tūi at the same time, cross 2 boxes.



If you then see 4 tūi together, cross up to box 4, not 6.



If you later see 3 tūi, stay at 4. Do not add up to 7.



If the count exceeds boxes, then enter the final number into the space provided.

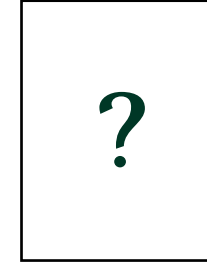

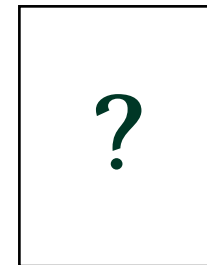

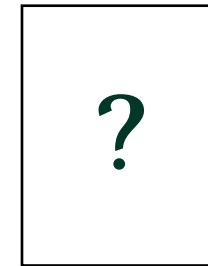
